SCREENING

*Performed by a Primary Care Provider
(PCP)*

PSA Test: Prostate-specific antigen blood test

- A result of 4/0 ng/mL and above is considered abnormal. Talk to your PCP ASAP.

DRE: Digital Rectal Exam

When to start screening:

- **AGE 50** - average risk
- **AGE 45** - higher risk (black men and those with family history)
- **AGE 40** - highest risk (multiple family members affected by prostate cancer at a young age)
