
# Students from Summer Research Division fellowship present projects at College of Medicine Symposium








The Center for Clinical & Translational Science & Training (CCTST) was recently awarded a \$37 million grant to continue the partnership between the UC College of Medicine and Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center in advancing translational science regionally and beyond. The award comes from both the National Center for Advancing Translational Sciences and institutional support to, "accelerate the discovery, dissemination, and implementation of innovative research that improves health across the lifespan."

The program aims to continuously improve the conduct of research and develop partnerships among researchers and communities for more effective reach and impact.


