## **Community Impact**

Who did the survey reach? Received over 2000 responses, residents or renters who live in apartments, condo buildings, or small-scale mixed-use buildings are those who stand to be impacted most by this new policy. This group was very underrepresented in those surveyed, with a deficit of 8%.
