

General Surgery MSSP

Program Overview

This MSSP offers highly motivated students a longitudinal opportunity to explore General Surgery. It includes clinical exposure, mentorship, and summer research with presentation and/or publication. Participants work toward earning a 'Distinction in Surgery' by graduation.

Program Goals

- Early and continuous exposure to General Surgery
- Engage in meaningful summer research projects
- Develop scholarly work for presentation or publication
- Establish strong mentoring relationships
- Explore leadership and service in surgical education

Year-by-Year Structure

Year 1

- 2 activities/month avg. over 6 months (shadowing, didactic, SIG, service, etc.)
- Assigned mentor; meet at least once

Summer Research

- Participate in CROSS, CREST, or CRIT research programs
- Basic/translational: \$2000 + \$1000 travel; Clinical/educational: \$3000 stipend

Year 2

- Continue with 2 activities/month avg. over 6 months
- Meet with mentor at least twice

Year 3

- Priority access to 2-week General Surgery specialty elective
- Meet mentor at least twice to review research and plan for M4/residency

Year 4

- Priority access to another 2-week elective
- Meet mentor at least twice to finalize scholarly work and residency preparation
