

Otolaryngology MSSP

The Otolaryngology MSSP is a unique program that offers one student each year the opportunity to delve deeper into the standard curriculum for the Department of Otolaryngology. This program provides an immersive experience, with a focus on areas such as head and neck cancer, sleep medicine, general ENT, otology, and facial plastic and reconstructive surgery. In addition to the hands-on experience, the student will be matched with a research mentor. Together, they will work on research projects aimed at producing a poster publication.

Objectives of the Otolaryngology MSSP:

1. Provide students with a broad exposure to the field of otolaryngology, including head and neck cancer, sleep medicine, general ENT, otology, and facial plastic and reconstructive surgery. This will be done by attending grand rounds, clinic and OR shadowing along with resident lectures.
2. To pair students with a research mentor, fostering a collaborative environment that encourages academic growth and research skills development.
3. To guide students in completing research projects with the goal of producing a poster publication, thereby enhancing their research portfolio and contributing to the field of otolaryngology.
