Care, LLC



Academic Health Center

- Comprised of Four Colleges at UC:
 - –COM:College of Medicine
 - -CON: College of Nursing
 - –COP: College of Pharmacy
 - –CAH: College of Allied Health





Governmental Entity

- An organization that is closely affiliated, generally by government ownership or control, with state and/or local government.
- UC is a governmental entity (instrumentality of the state of Ohio)
- Impact:
 - Employee wages not covered by Social Security
 - Ohio Ethics Rules
 - Sunshine Laws



Public University

- Receives significant financial support from public funds via the State and must comply with all accounting & financial reporting standards set by GASB (Governmental Accounting Standards Board.
- UC is also a public university.
- Impact:
 - UC receives support from the State of Ohio
 - Opportunity to apply for grants and other opportunities not available to the general public



Non-Profit

- An organization that uses it's surplus revenues to achieve a purpose of mission, rather than distributing its profits to directors or owners.
- UCP is an Ohio non-profit organization.
- UCPC, UCMC, WCH, Drake, and UC Health are single member LLC's of UC Healthcare System, which is an Ohio non-profit organization.
- Impact:
 - Non-profit organizations are generally not subject to state and local income tax on the organization's net income




Tax-Exempt 501(c)(3)

- Federal Internal Revenue Code term. Represents an organization that is operated exclusively for exempt purposes as a charitable organization and is exempt from most federal taxes.
- UCP is a tax-exempt 501(c)(3) corporation
- UC Healthcare System is a tax-exempt 501(c)(3) corporation
- UCPC, UCMC, WCH, and Drake are all "single-member" limited liability corporations, which means they are "disregarded" for Federal tax purposes. However, they are treated similarly as a 501(c)(3) corporation.
- Impact:
 - Tax-exempt organizations do not pay Federal income tax on net income related to their primary business functions.
 - However, they may owe tax on "unrelated" business income
 - Opportunity to obtain funding (issue bonds) at lower rates

Working in the UC Family

- Billing providers are employed by UC/UCP
- CRC's employed by UC
- Ambulatory Clinic Staff employed by UCPC
- Administrative Staff (EDBA's/BA's) supporting providers and clinical departments generally employed by UC/UCP
- Administrative Staff supporting hospitals and ambulatory staff employed by UC Health and related entities



Credentialing

- Billing Providers are employed by UC/UCP, but must obtain credentials to practice at UC Health facilities
- Credentialing activities performed by UC Health through Medical Staff Services



Clinical Trials

- Historically clinical trials (and supporting staff/expenses) were at UCPC
- Starting in 2022, new trials are set up at UC
- CRC staff who are employed by UC/UCP may still work on trials housed at UC Health
- Signalpath
- EPIC



Compliance

- Billing providers employed by UC/UCP
- Compliance activities (audits, coding verification, etc.) performed by UC Health Compliance Team



Information Technology

- IT responsibility generally follows location (i.e. whichever entity owns the building provides the IT/infrastructure in the building)
- UC and UC Health provide affiliate access as needed to employees who work at both entities



Expense Reimbursement

- Out-of-pocket expenses are reimbursed by the employer
- For clinical expenses that are incurred/reimbursed by UC, they are passed over to UC Health/UCPC through the employee lease/PPR











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
